What is Cygnet?

The Cygnet Core Programme is a basic awareness-raising package for parents and/or carers of children and young people with an autistic spectrum condition (ASC). It has been created by children's charity Barnardo's. The course is delivered by practitioners who have experience of working with pupils with ASC across the age range and across the spectrum, and the course aims to work towards supporting and developing the young person's communication skills and behaviour.

Who is the course for?

Parents and/or carers of a child or young people with an autistic spectrum diagnosis that want to learn more about it. There is space for up to 12 people on each course. We are commissioned to support families in Sevenoaks district.

What does the course cover?

Cygnet is designed to raise awareness of:

- 1. Introduction
- 2. An Overview
- 3. Sensory Needs
- 4. Communication
- 5. Understanding Behaviour
- 6. Supporting Behaviour
- 7. Parent's Choice

The course is delivered over seven 2.5-hour sessions from 9.30am to 12pm

What level of commitment is needed?

All course members should try to attend every session. The course is very informative, and sessions will need to start promptly; start and finish times will be considerate of school runs and travelling time. We also offer a three-month post-course follow up session, which will be arranged with each group at the beginning of the course.

What costs are involved?

We ask for a £5 contribution to cover our photocopying costs per family and £5 for refreshments for each adult attending for the whole course. Apart from that, the Cygnet core programme is free for parents and/or carers.

Why should I attend a Cygnet course?

At its core, Cygnet acknowledges parents as the experts when it comes to their own children. The underpinning value in the development of the Cygnet programme is the belief that if parents and carers have access to appropriate knowledge, skills and support, they can often find practical solutions to build confidence in family life.
