Winter Challenges!

Dear Parents and Carers

This weekend is predicted to be very warm with lovely summer days that we didn't have in the summer holidays! That, of course may lull us into thinking that winter isn't just around the corner but we are already in October and the respiratory infections that come with the autumn and winter are already upon us. It wasn't long ago that our lives were dominated by Covid and that we were taking extraordinary measures to prevent it spreading. But, we are all now much more relaxed about it and the threat it poses. However, together with influenza and other infections it has not gone away. The cases of Covid in the school has been rising and many students and staff have been infected. To avoid the virus having a detrimental impact on the ability of the school to function or indeed to be a threat to those most susceptible to severe illness we are promoting the following precautionary measures:

- 1. Any child or member of staff who is unwell with a respiratory infection should not come to school. If a student tests for Covid they should remain off school for three days from the onset of infection. Staff have to remain off for 5 days. For all infections people should only attend school when they are well;
- Students and staff are encouraged to be vaccinated against both Covid and Influenza. Students were
 offered and received the influenza vaccine at school. If your child has not received their flu jab please
 contact your GP. Covid vaccinations are available through a national booking system but for
 vulnerable children it is best to contact your GP for advice.
- 3. Handwashing and other hygiene measures are important at all times and more so during the periods when infectious diseases are more prevalent. We have introduced further measures in school and will continue to be vigilant as we try to reduce the transmission of Covid and other infectious illnesses.

Above all else we must remember that many of our students will be particularly vulnerable to any infection - we all have to work together to protect them!

Despite all of this I hope that the sunshine will brighten your weekend!

The polytunnel is now nearly 9 years old and the cover had deteriorated so this was replaced in July. We also had 2 new raised growing areas built outside the polytunnel in June again increasing our overall growing area.






We have had some amazing crops this year which Students have harvested and taken to the kitchen to be cooked and served usually the following day.

We currently have crops being taken down to the kitchen weekly, all the crops are grown from seed by the

students, they look after them and then harvest when ready and deliver to the kitchen themselves.




This summer students harvested, carrots, leeks, beetroot, spring onions, spinach, melons, strawberries, blackcurrants (5kg) and gooseberries (4kg). We had a bumper crop of

dinner on the first week of this term and since then enough cabbage has been harvested for 2 lunchtime servings. The spinach is harvested weekly and delivered to the kitchen, as are the chillis. We harvested 30 sweetcorn cobs and are now waiting to harvest the butternut squash, sweet potato and pumpkins.

This year we have a lot going on in DT. Hawking pathway students are working hard on projects building knowledge and skills towards GCSE.

Younger students have been introduced to CAD/CAM (Computer-Aided Design/ Manufacture) in the form of the keyring project. Students use computers to design key ring fobs and then cut them out on our laser cutter.



Older students are building on these skills with more advanced CAD-based projects such as a 3D Animal, Salad Fork or Bottle Opener. We work largely with CAD/CAM for Hawking students because it offers independence and an accuracy that helps students create products of a very high quality.

Simmonds classes who are doing DT will be working on a Christmas tree project for the first 2 terms.

The plan is for students to create 2 slotted Christmas trees, one that they will take home and the other to be sold in the school shop.
