#### Winter weather and other challenges

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

This week's weather has been a timely reminder of what we may face during the winter months. However, severe weather is only one of the challenges that winter brings - the other main relates to infectious diseases and staffing levels.

#### Severe weather

Whilst there was early warning that heavy rain and high winds were to be expected conditions varied greatly from place to place. We received guidance from KCC on Wednesday afternoon and alerted you as soon as possible. In the event at Valence our major challenge was heavy rain with the worst of the gales further south. A significant number of parents kept their sons and daughters off school on Thursday and those decisions can only be reasonably taken by yourselves. Thank you very much for the communications we received from you which was very helpful

Schools are expected to do all they can to remain open but ultimately any decision to close lies with the headteacher. Valence has a particularly challenging site which can soon be rendered unusable if we have to deal with snow and ice or fallen trees. We have contingencies in place but as we have students who board we have to ensure sufficient staffing to support them which may mean we have to close the school to day students on some occasions. We will use both emails and text messages to contact you so if there have been any changes to your contact detail please inform the school as soon as possible - Thank you. #### Infectious diseases

There are numerous infectious diseases which become more prevalent in the winter. They include Influenza, Covid an the Winter Vomiting bug. Good hygiene is essential in reducing the spread of infections but so is avoiding people who have infections or symptoms of them not mixing with other people, particularly those whose health is vulnerable, which, of course a large number of our children and young people. Please do not send your son/daughter to school if they have a raised temperature, are feeling unwell or have symptoms that could indicate an infection such as coughing and sneezing.

Going back to this week's weather we are pleased that there were no significant issues at school although the lake is overflowing on to the cricket pitch so it is a good job that the season is over!

Finally the Friends shop - Valence on the Green - is now open (an official opening will follow) - do pop in and buy something and enjoy a coffee and cake whilst you do so! 
