Dear Parents and Carers

Friday 1 March is St. David's Day so warmest wishes to anyone who has Welsh roots or connections. Friday is also International Wheelchair Day.

International Wheelchair Day is always 1 March and is an annual day of events and activities which take place around the World when wheelchair users celebrate the positive impact a wheelchair has on their lives.

Since it was first launched in 2008, celebrations have taken place in Australia, Nepal, Senegal, South Africa, Bangladesh, Pakistan, United Kingdom and United States of America.

The Aims of International Wheelchair Day

To enable wheelchair users to celebrate the positive impact a wheelchair has in their lives.

To celebrate the great work of the many millions of people who provide wheelchairs, who provide support and care for wheelchair users and who make the World a better and more accessible place for people with mobility issues.

To acknowledge and react constructively to the fact there are many tens of millions of people in the World who need a wheelchair, but are unable to acquire one.

Wheelchairs transform the lives of people who for whatever reason cannot walk or have limited mobility. Over the years I have personally seen how wheelchairs have developed and changed and what a positive difference they make to the students at Valence. Being able to be independently mobile must be considered to be a fundamental human right. Sadly, as the point above makes clear, for so many people that right is denied them.


When I came to Valence (*you might have to endure a bit of this before I retire!*) there were manual chairs and every child who needed a wheelchair had one provided by the NHS. For those children and young people who could not self-propel the NHS would, after assessment consider issuing a powered chairs (all the same type) for indoor use only. They had small wheels and weren't really appropriate for outdoor use but of course students used them both outside at school and at home - exercising their fundamental right to move around independently if they could, choosing where they wished to go. Over time this led to policy changes and powered wheelchairs became available from the NHS for use in all settings which is what we see today. Of course, there are also privately funded and charity funded wheelchairs and there are options for people to have a wheelchair costing as much as a car if they can afford it!

At Valence we don't focus on wheelchairs, however important they are, but on the people who use them! International Wheelchair Day must celebrate how wheelchairs enhance and positively change the lives of people who have disabilities!



'Baby picture pair-up' and 'don't judge a book'



Computer Science




