We live in challenging financial times but for the school to succeed and flourish it is legally required to produce a balanced budget. We will do this in ways that minimise the impact on students and maximise the opportunities that they have. After Easter we will communicate with you about this.

*"I liked it when they used the magnets to show levitation."* - Freddie.


*"I thought it was amazing! The levitation, the bang, the big pot of liquid nitrogen. It was fun while being educational."* - Bella.





## News from Science

Since Christmas, science has been a very busy place at Valence. Starting just after the holidays Hawking 3 were given a great opportunity to go and visit Sevenoaks school where they were able to do some science workshops. They students were spilt into 2 groups and visited Sevenoaks school on the week they weren't swimming. They had a go at all three sciences with a chemistry demonstration with Dr P, and a biology and a physics workshop ran by Mrs Mylod with the help of some of her students. All three workshops were brilliant but a favourite amongst the students was Dr P's screaming jelly baby!!



After the February half term, we started looking towards science week with more trips to Sevenoaks school. On Tuesday the 27th February Hawking 1 were the first class to go on a trip and enjoyed a Liquid nitrogen show with the head of the physics department.



Hawking 1 enjoyed the show which ended with a very exciting explosion of ping pong balls!!



Later that same day Hawking 2 were able to go and experience a powerless flight workshop where again, the physics department, excelled themselves. Valence students were all able to make their own gliders with the help of some of the Sevenoaks students and staff. Mr Lloyd insisted that when we got them back to school that we should give them another try and through them out of the staff room window in stable block. At the end of the show the group were all able to get a close up look at the planets and get a fabulous group picture.



Hawking 5






